Note from the Principal

Dear Girdwood PK-8 School Families,

I hope 2024 is treating you well and you have been enjoying the large amount of snow we have this year!

The AK Reads Act has brought new discussions and planning for teachers. We have been working with students that need extra support to get where they need to be based on their grade level in reading. Teachers are working on specific skills based on benchmark assessments each day with students that are below proficiency. If your child is struggling with reading, there is a free tutoring service that is offered for K-2 students through the Alyeska Reading Institute (ARI). ARI provides intervention materials & tutoring services at no cost. You can contact Melinda Krise at melinda.krise@alaska.gov or call 907-269-0124.

The Alaska Reads Act requires teachers to speak to K-3 parents at parent/teacher conferences regarding progression and non-progression (repeating a grade or being held back) if your child is well-below in reading. Please don't be alarmed by this as we work as a school community team and look forward to continuing supports for your child so they can continue to make growth.

The Anchorage School District is partnering with the Association of Alaska School Boards to conduct the School Climate and Connectedness Survey ©, a statewide survey for students, staff, and families. This survey measures perceptions of each school's climate, including the engagement of students, staff, and families. We value and need input from our Girdwood School families. You are an important partner as we work to continually improve our school's environment. We are asking that one parent/guardian complete one survey from now until March 15th. If you have more than one child attending our school, you only need to fill out one survey. The survey should take less than 5 minutes. Here is the link for accessing the family survey: https://surveys.panoramaed.com/aasb/asdfamily Select Girdwood K-8 School and complete the survey. All of the surveys are voluntary, anonymous, confidential, and do not ask questions about students' families. Results from this survey will be used to identify student, staff and family perceptions of school climate issues within our school(s). School staff use the results to inform their efforts to ensure schools are safe, supportive, and caring places for all students. The survey is available in English, Spanish, Tagalog, Hmong, and Samoan. Families can toggle to their target language in the upper left-hand corner. Thank you for your cooperation in this year's School Climate and Connectedness Survey©.

Just a few other reminders, second quarter report cards are now available to view on the Parent Portal. Also, we are excited to see our boys and girls cross-country ski team underway! We hope you take a moment to attend one of their meets to cheer them on at some point this winter!

We are looking forward to a wonderful second half of the year and hope you can continue to help us continue to demonstrate our school motto of being respectful, responsible, and ready to do our best! Please let us know if there is anything you need to ensure your child has a successful second semester.

Moose Safety

Parents—teach kids to Be KidSafe around moose:

- · Don't scream and run
- · Never get between a mother moose and its calf

- Keep at least 100 feet away (2 houses) from any moose and twice as far from one with a calf
- Get behind something big if a moose comes toward you
- Avoid moose: go back home, to school, to the nearest Safe Home or find a different, safe walking route
- · Don't try to pet or feed moose
- · Don't throw snowballs or objects at moose

Signs of a moose ready to attack:

It dashes around, its ears go down, it will lick its lips, and the hair goes
up on the back of its neck. You are too close if you can see all this!

Starting with the graduating class of 2028 (current 8th graders), Anchorage School District is introducing a comprehensive wall-to-wall career academy model, known as the Academies of Anchorage.

The Academies of Anchorage is dedicated to providing every student with career opportunities and essential workplace skills. In 9th grade, students will kick off their high school journey in a Freshman Academy, which includes a Career Exploration course designed to promote a smooth transition from middle school to high school, support academic success, and help students explore career pathways. After school, students enjoy playing with friends and classmates on the school playground. We enjoy having them here, but cannot provide outdoor supervision after 3:15 p.m. School dismisses at 3 p.m and, for safety reasons, students are expected to head for home, FVCS classes, or after school care on buses, bikes, feet or in a parent vehicles by 3:15. School doors will be locked promptly at 3:15.

Students are more than welcome to stay on the playground if they are with a supervising adult. This is true for all students, including middle school. The only exception is when students remain to participate in school or FVCS supervised activities. Thank you for your help in keeping all the children in our valley safe and supervised.
