Principal's Corner

Dear ERE Families!

Can you believe we are approaching the end of the first quarter! Students and staff have been working hard to establish community and learn classroom and schoolwide expectations. I am extremely proud of our students and staff! Academics are in full swing, and we are finding our stride. Excitement is in the air!

With all the wet weather we have had this fall, the white stuff is sure to show itself before we know it. Don't be caught off guard! Now is the time to dust off the snow boots and round up gloves and hats.

Parent-Teacher conferences will be conducted October 23rd and 24th. Conferences will be held in the afternoon on these days and school ends at 12:30. Students will be eating lunch at school on the half days. There will be NO SCHOOL on the 18th and the 25th to complete report cards and to facilitate professional development for teachers. Sibling conference notes will come home Tuesday, October 8th.

The rest of the students will bring home a conference note Thursday outlining how to schedule online. We understand that many of our families have blended and/or separate home situations but unless there is court issued orders keeping individuals apart, we need to have parents meet together with teachers; an administrator can be there for support if needed and one or both parents can decide to participate via phone or Zoom as well. ERE teachers are looking forward to the opportunity to share your child's progress with you!

This month we also want to discuss school safety. Across the district every month, schools hold Evacuation (Fire) Drills and quarterly we practice Earthquake Drills, Stay Put Drills (threat is

outside the school but we are safe inside,) and ALICE Drills – this is to prepare students in case of an Active Shooter. We have already practiced evacuating the school to our alternative safety site, First Baptist Church. We discussed in an age-appropriate way how to address the situation if there is an active intruder or threat in the building with your children. We explained to students that there are multiple ways to respond to a threat and that the teacher will make the best decision for the group. Depending upon the age of the children, we explained that the choices are to evacuate the area, counter (fight back) or hide. The Great Alaska Shake-Out (Earthquake Drill) will also take place on October 17th at all ASD school sites.

Our students' success comes through your involvement. When families are partners in their children's education, the results are better attendance, increased motivation, higher self-esteem, and improved achievement. Thanks for being an integral part of a winning team!

24-25 ERES Fun Run Fundraiser is off and "running"!

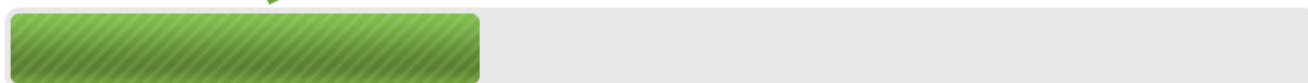

School Psych Secrets with Mr. Brown

As the school year gets started, families often start to notice behavior in their students that can impact students at home, at school, and even with getting to school. In education, we consider all behavior to be a form of communication. If a student is engaged in behavior, there is something that they want but are not getting. Below is a brief overview of the four primary functions of behavior.

Understanding the Function of Behavior: A Key to Supporting Students

In the world of school psychology, understanding why a student behaves a certain way is crucial to creating effective interventions. All behavior serves a purpose or function, and by identifying that function, we can better address students' needs. Generally, behavior can serve one of four main functions:

1. **Attention** – Some students may act out or engage in certain behaviors to gain attention from peers, teachers, or parents.
2. **Escape/Avoidance** – Behaviors may be used to avoid or escape tasks, situations, or people that are difficult or uncomfortable.
3. **Access to Tangibles** – Sometimes, students may behave in certain ways to gain access to desired items, activities, or privileges.
4. **Sensory/Automatic Reinforcement** – In some cases, behavior is self-stimulating or soothing, such as fidgeting, and isn't linked to external rewards.

Understanding the function behind a behavior helps us create more targeted and effective support plans for students, ensuring they receive the guidance they need to thrive in school.

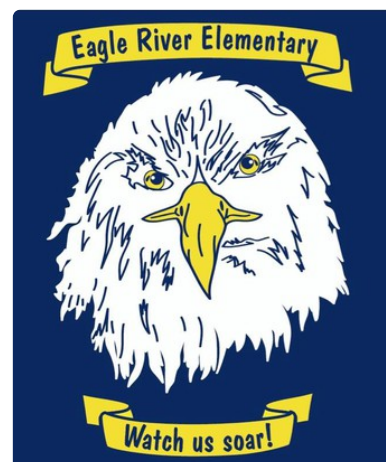

Daily Schedule

Below is Eagle River Elementary's usual schedule. Our schedule is subject to change without warning, but we will do our best to communicate any unanticipated, sudden schedule changes.

Monday:

- School doors open at 8:45 for students and school begins at 9:00. Students arriving before 8:45 will be directed to the MPR aka lunch room where they will wait until 9:45 with the option of sitting quietly or reading a book.
- Breakfast begins at 8:50 and is eaten in the classroom.

Tuesday through Friday:

- School doors open at 7:45 for students and school begins at 8:00. Students may not be dropped off early to wait.
- Breakfast begins at 7:50 and is eaten in the classroom
- 11:00-11:50 Recess then lunch for Dyches, Jones, Cano, & Dente
- 11:00-11:50 Lunch then recess for Sorensen, Reynolds, Hatmaker, & King
- 12:00-12:50 Lunch then recess for Hahn, Spain, Long, & Seebold
- Dismissal is at 2:30 each day

School grounds are closed from 7:30 to 3:00. After dismissal, students must go home first and then are welcome to return after 3:00 to play on the playground.

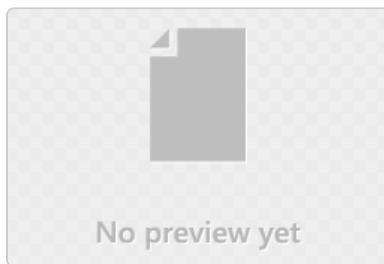

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

-Arrival:

- **On Monday, school begins at 9:00am instead of 8:00am.** If your student arrives before 8:45am on PLC Mondays, they will be brought into the building and students will sit in the MPR/lunchroom and sit quietly until 8:45am when the bell rings. Our breakfast service will start at 8:45 am.
- **On Tuesday through Friday, students will be let in at 7:45am.** There will be no supervision until then. **Students will not be allowed to wait before 7:45am. Please time your child's arrival so they're here no earlier than 7:45am.** We appreciate your help with this so we can make sure students are supervised and safe!
- **Student Drop-off will be at the stop sign at the front corner of the building and students will enter the front door. Students will not be allowed to be dropped off until 7:45am.** All students enter through the front door. Students will enter the building and sit on the floor outside their classrooms where they will be supervised by staff until the 7:50am bell (Kindergarten students will sit in the front hallway.)

Eagle River Elementary's policy for late drop-off is that families must come in and sign late students in. Students who arrive after the final bell are considered tardy and must be signed in by their adult before going to class.

-Dismissal (please see farther down for preschool): To help students understand how/where they will leave the building at the end of the day, Eagle River Elementary uses three groupings to differentiate dismissal routines: parent pick-up, walkers, and bus riders.

- If your student will be picked up in a car, then they are considered parent pick-up. ERES uses a car tag number system and each family is assigned a specific number. Please hang your car tag on your rear-view mirror so staff in the parent pick-up area know what students go to each car. Pick-up will take place in our main parking lot. There will be two lines- if you turn left out of the parking lot after picking up your student(s), then you will need to join the left lane and join the right lane if you turn right.
- If your student walks home **or** you will meet them in front of the building, they are considered walkers.
- Students that ride a school bus or go to Taekwondo are considered bus riders. Bus information is available on ParentConnect for stop location and pick-up/drop-off time.

If families are picking a student up before the end of the day, then they must come to the front office to sign students out. The office staff will not call students down before an authorized pick-up person is physically in the front office. Please be sure to bring valid identification to pick up your student. **After 2:15 pm, we will not call students down from the classroom for early pick-up.**

It is incredibly important that any changes to how your student is getting home are communicated to the office before 2:00 pm. The end of the day is one of the busiest times in the office. Please be sure to communicate same-day dismissal changes directly to the office and not your student's teacher.

Thank you for helping us to get your student home safely!

Any long-term or permanent changes to how your student will be going home need to be communicated to their teacher as well as the office.

Preschool: Dismissal for preschool is 12pm each day. At the end of the day, preschool families will park in the bus lane for pick-up. Please pull all the way forward to the end of the bus loop (not around the turn), park, turn off your vehicle, and stay seated inside your car until you see the preschool students exit through the middle doors. Once the preschool students have exited the building, families may then come to pick up and sign out their student. Families are required to sign their student out with the preschool staff each day.

Breakfast & Lunch

Eagle River Elementary serves breakfast and lunch each school day for students that would like to purchase meals at school. Breakfast is served starting at 8:50am Monday/7:50am Tuesday-Friday, and is eaten in the classroom. Families may view the breakfast/lunch menu by going to schoolcafe.com/anchorage, clicking "Guest Account", and using the drop-down menu to select our school. For any food allergy concerns,, please contact our school nurse Jennifer Brusehaber by calling (907) 742-3000.

For students who bring their lunch to school, please be sure your student is able to open their lunch. There are lunch supervisors to assist and monitor students, but assistance is limited when there are over a hundred students in the lunchroom. It is important, especially for the younger students, to practice opening their lunch boxes, containers, and food packaging to be independent and successful during their lunch time. Eagle River Elementary does not offer microwaves for student use.

Did you know you may qualify for free or greatly reduced lunch prices? To apply for the free/reduced lunch program, families will need to go online to schoolcafe.com/anchorage and click "Apply for Benefits" after creating an account if you do not already have one. Paper applications may be mailed in to ASD Student Nutrition department or dropped off at the school/Student Nutrition Center. Attendance/Arrival Policy Reminders

Students who arrive after the 8AM bell are considered tardy and will need to stop in the office to get a tardy pass before being admitted to class.

Please call the main line and press "1" for the attendance line if your child will be absent. Absences must be reported by 9:00am to ensure your student's attendance is entered. Families may also submit attendance requests through Q/Parent Connect. Automatic attendance calls alerting for unexcused absences go out at 9:45.

When leaving an attendance message for your student please leave these important details:

- 1) Student Name
- 2) Date(s) of absence

- 3) Reason for absence
- 4) Teachers Name
- 5) Grade Level

Many messages are left saying the student will be out but do not leave a reason. Without a reason, the student is automatically marked unexcused. When you know you will be on an extended absence like a family vacation, we can put a prearranged unexcused absence in the system so you do not get a daily phone call.

ASD Attendance Guidelines

Here are the District Guidelines for Attendance:

AM (starts at 8:00 am)

- Tardy - up to 60 minutes after school starts
- Absent (.5 day) – If a student misses more than 60 minutes.

PM (starts at 12:15 pm)

- Tardy – arrives at or before 12:15pm
- Absent (.5 day) – student misses more than 60 minutes
