The 2021-2022 school year is off to a great start. I am extremely excited that we started the year of with in-person learning just like we ended last year. I truly enjoyed welcoming our students back.

Our three main school goals this year are: attendance, social emotional learning, and academics. When a student attends school on a regular basis their academics will soar. Even missing a day, means your student could miss the introduction of a reading or math skill and that will negatively impact their academic progress. Parents we need your help! I am already noticing that several students are missing more than 1 day of school and we have not finished the month of September. Medical appointments are important, but ensure your students attends school before or after that appointment. Again, this year, parents should be calling the attendance line when your student will not be at school. If you have COVID guestions, please call our school nurse and she can answer those for you.

Social Emotional Learning is another key to student success. When students feel safe at school it positively impacts their academics. Ptarmigan is using a curriculum called Second Steps to help teach students to regulate their behavior and be advocates for themselves.

Our last goal is increased academic rigor. Both our Reach for Reading curriculum and our new Ready Math curriculum is age appropriate, but also challenging. Along with on grade level academics, we are also implementing time within the student day to teach missing skills due to COVID.

SAEBRS Parent Notification

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This year, our school will be again using a screener to look at school-wide systems of support for social emotional learning and behavior. This screener, much like our academic Universal Screeners (FastBridge and MAP Growth), will be completed with all students in the Fall (September), Winter (December) and Spring (April). Teachers will rate students relative to various behavioral risk factors. The assessment is called the Social, Academic, and Emotional Behavior Risk Screener (SAEBRS). The tool will help teachers identify what additional structures they might place in their classrooms and as well as identifying students who may need additional supports to increase their academic and social emotional success. This screening is completed by teachers and will not take away from instructional time nor require input/answers from students. "Notes" From the Ptarmigan Music Room.



Happy Dance! What a treat to welcome students back into the music room at Ptarmigan Elementary! I am Mrs. Benton your student's music teacher. I want to welcome all the new Ptarmigan students and also my returning musicians. My hope is that all students will develop excellent ears and learn all about the musical elements. There are so many things to do in the music room

First, students are learning how to be safe and respectful with each other. Then, we will move on to treating the instruments and space in the music room safely. Each class is dedicating themselves to making the music room a safe and caring place to learn. We are following these rules in the music room:

- Being Respectful
- Active Listening
- Cooperating
- Participating

Using our singing voices is the first step. We sing in the music room. Your voice is the one instrument you always have with you. I believe if you can sing it, you can play it. We also learn to listen and listen to learn.

Choir starts on September 16th at 8:00 am. All third, fourth and fifth graders who enjoy singing and performing are welcome to attend. Make sure to have a signed permission slip. We will be performing a concert in December so let the singing begin!

Students at Ptarmigan get a once or twice weekly effort grade in music. Students also work on self-assessment based on the following criteria:

- 5= Leader in the class, pushing yourself to do your personal best. Respectful, Actively Listening, Cooperating and Participating
- 4= Without Reminders you are Respectful, Actively Listening, Cooperating and Participating
- 3= Few Reminders about being Respectful, Actively Listening, Cooperating and Participating
- 2= Several Reminders
- 1= Removed from the activity for most of the lesson

Fourth and Fifth graders also get an academic grade in music. This academic grade is based on instrument playing technique, musical terminology, music history, creating music and performing music along with music notation and singing.

In the music room we are keeping our distance and keeping our masks on! Let's work to keep us all safe so we can continue to learn and love music.

Student Injuries and Insurance 2021-2022 School Year

Dear Parent/Legal Guardian:

The safety of our students is of critical importance to all of us and we want to protect them from injury. Even so, accidents do happen (at school and elsewhere) and required medical care can be expensive. Please know that your school **does not** assume responsibility for such costs but does offer you access to several student accident insurance plans for voluntary purchase. Details can be found at www.myers-stevens.com.

Options are available to cover your child 24/7, anywhere in the world or you can limit coverage to school-related injuries only. The plans <u>do not</u> restrict your choice of doctors or hospitals. However, you'll also have access to an extensive network of providers with discounted fees. Seeking care through contracted providers may further reduce your out-of-pocket costs, particularly if your child needs surgery or hospitalization.

Also offered is the pay-as-you-go **Student Accident & Sickness Plan** which <u>covers sickness</u> as well as injury, in and out of school. The **Dental Accident** plan can be of particular value with younger students as final treatment to injured teeth often needs to be deferred until after they mature.

Common emergency benefits – Regardless of the benefit level selected, all of the accident medical plans and the *Student Accident & Sickness Plan* will cover eligible charges for *Ambulance, Emergency Room and Emergency Room Physician* at 100% of Usual, Customary and Reasonable charges (UCR) up to plan limits.

Enhanced benefits for qualified concussions – If an insured student suffers a concussion while participating in any covered activity and is consequently removed from play from his/her interscholastic sport per the school's formal concussion protocols, then any deductible or inside limit features of the plan are waived and eligible charges for the evaluation and treatment of the concussion are paid at 100% of UCR subject to remaining policy terms and conditions.

Interscholastic Sports – Please know that all plans offered (other than the Dental Accident Plan) may be used to comply with applicable state and local insurance requirements for participation in interscholastic sports (coverage for tackle football is offered on a stand-alone basis).

COVID-19 – After schools were physically closed in March of 2020, the administrator of this program - Myers-Stevens & Toohey (MST) worked with the underwriting insurance company to make several adjustments to the insurance program. In brief, they included: 1) qualified extension of coverage to distance learning at home; 2) qualified coverage for COVID-19 testing costs; 3) the addition of Telemedicine as a covered service; 4) qualified extension of coverage for school activities pushed beyond the last day of instruction; 5) related extension of coverage to graduated students participating in such postponed activities and 6) modified claims forms and procedures. **Details can be found on the MST website www.myers-stevens.com**. At this time, these adjustments continue

to apply to the 2021-2022 School Year insurance program. As matters concerning COVID continue to evolve, updates will be posted on the MST website

You are strongly encouraged to carefully review the information provided. If your child already has health coverage, the student insurance plans offered can also be used to expand choice of providers and help cover the high deductibles and 30% to 40% cost sharing obligations imposed by many health plans today.

To enroll, please follow the instructions in the attached brochure. Enrollment is also available by going to www.myers-stevens.com. While your child is eligible to enroll at any time, one-time-pay rates for the accident medical plans and Dental Accident Plan are the same regardless of enrollment date. As such, you are encouraged to consider enrollment now in order to include coverage for this summer and the full 2021-2022 School Year. Once processing is completed, an ID card verifying coverage will be mailed home to you.
