
Join Mr. Uson for morning tutoring. 1st - 6th grade Permission slip is required to participate.

We want our children to be seen along the roads coming to and from school and when they are outand-about in the evening. This allows the drivers more time and opportunity to slowdown and be safe around kids.

Winter driving can be a challenge as it is dark and icy. This is a very high traffic time with young children out and about. Having reflective tape or blinky gadgets applied to backpacks or jackets is safer when children are out and about. Also, we request that parents picking up students at the end of the day use the drive through in the parking lot or park in designated and legal areas along Hoonah to avoid blocking traffic or creating unsafe conditions for young children who are walking home.

Students tend to be excited because of the seasonal events and the upcoming break. It is helpful if students get a good night's sleep and parents reinforce their expectations for school. We appreciate your support!

Teachers are administering the Aimsweb mid-year and MAP Growth benchmark assessments in reading, math, and writing. We are looking for 100% completion rate. Teachers use this information to guide instruction and to monitor students' progress. If your family is leaving early for the holidays and Winter Break, please let teachers or the front office know a head of time. It is helpful so teachers can take attendance issues in consideration with end of the quarter assessments. Also, if you are PCSing, please contact the school office and complete the withdrawal paperwork two week in advance or as soon as possible.

Please review the school calendar and newsletter to stay informed of school events! We are very excited for this time of winter. Gaining light is right around the corner as December 21, will be our shortest day!

This is the season for many families to give gifts, please consider replenishing those school supplies such as pencils, crayons, glue, etc. Many students love to start the new-year with a brand new full set of supplies!
