

AK Reads Act

Kindergarten through third grade is the critical window to developing strong reading skills to be successful in school. In Alaska, all students in grades K-3 are administered an approved literacy screening assessment three times a year. Educators review the results of the screener to identify areas of strength and areas of need for each student. During Parent Teacher Conferences, 2/26-

2/27, teachers will meet with you to review data, share strengths, and areas of growth to focus in on.


