JOB OPPORTUNITIES AT KINCAID

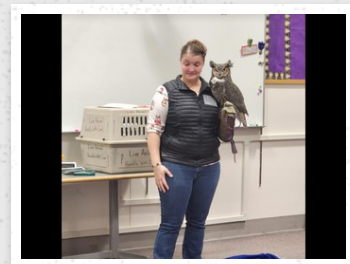
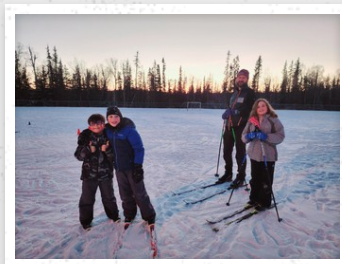
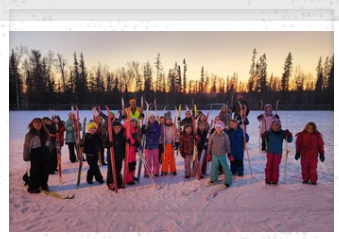
Kindergarten Paraprofessionals: These positions work with a classroom teacher. They often work with individual students who require extra support. They may prepare materials for the teacher and provide assessments. They also are our recess managers and spend four 30 minute recesses outside to supervise students during outdoor play. We have two open positions.

Special Education Paraprofessionals: We have one opening in our special education resource program. Paraprofessionals work under the supervision of a special education teacher to work with individual or small groups of children who have special education services.

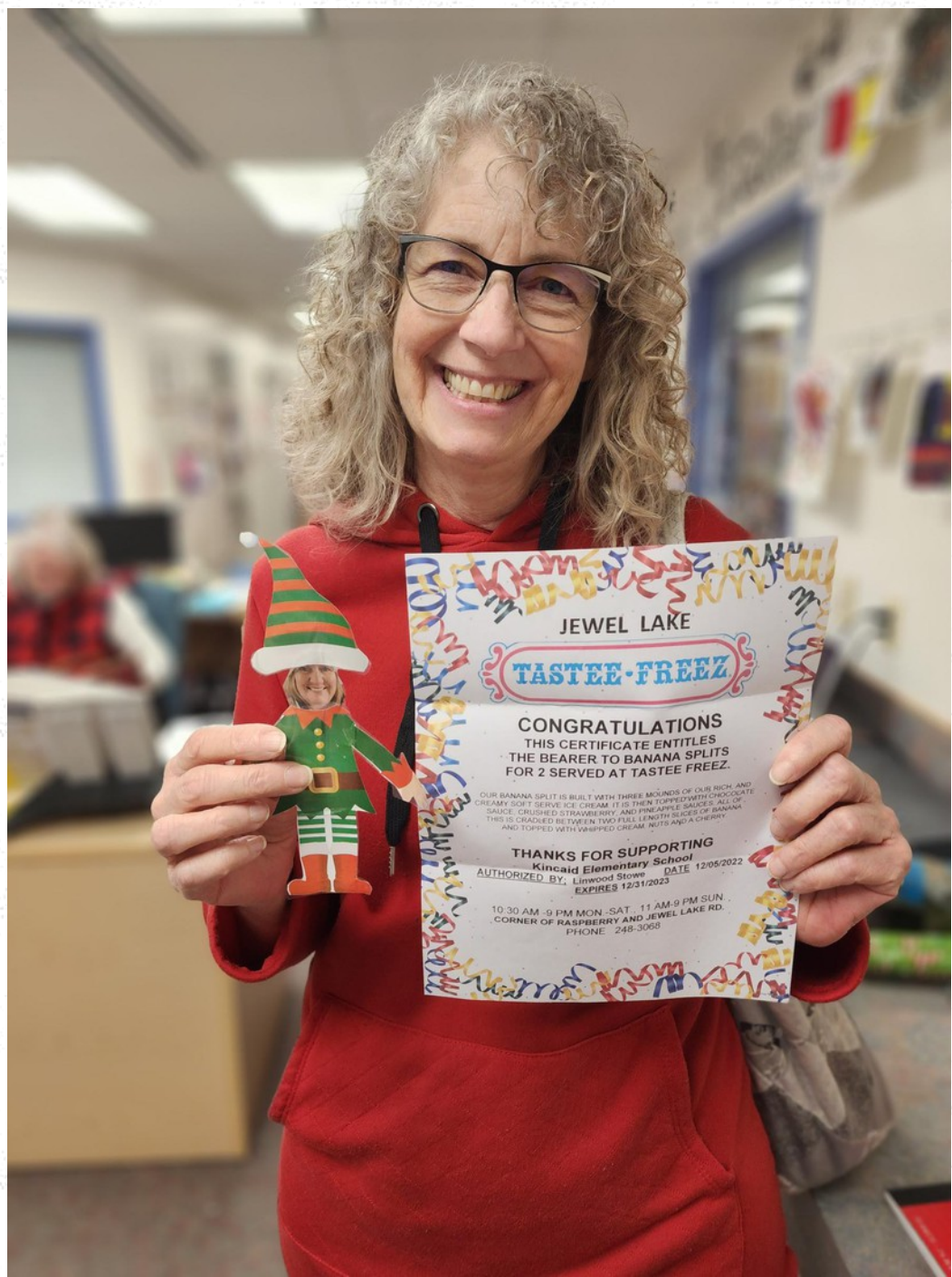
Cafeteria Manger: ASD has had a shortage of mangers this school year. We may not serve hot meals until we have a trained manager assigned to our kitchen.
