#### PROPOSITION 1 INCLUDES WORK AT KINCAID ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Bond Work at Kincaid Elementary School

 Design and Construction funding for the replacement of the sloped roof areas at Kasuun and Kincaid Elementary Schools. Currently, the roof has leaks that cannot continue to be patched. A long-term repair is required. The number of leaks has been consistent over the last 6 years. The leaks are in areas such as classrooms, admin area, gym, library, and corridors. This project will provide a new membrane roofing assembly that will last for 20 – 30 years and will be easy to maintain.

Benefits if project is funded:

- The project will protect the integrity of the building and contents.
- Students and staff will not have the distraction of dripping water from the roof.

Estimated Taxpayer Impact

• The approximate amount of annual taxes on \$100,000 of assessed property valuation to retire the proposed debt of \$37.787 million is **\$8.03**.
