What is Migrant Education?

The Anchorage School District Migrant Education Program provides resources, services and activities to increase opportunities for children to participate in Anchorage's educational community. Program activities are available to eligible children 3-19 years of age who do not have a high school diploma.

Our goal is to help migrant children develop to their fullest academic and social potential, and to provide learning opportunities for success in life.

Parental involvement

Parent participation is a major component of the Migrant Education Program. Parents are the first and most important teachers of their children. They are role models for values, principles and conduct.

Who is eligible?

Children under the age of 20 who accompany their parents or guardians for seasonal fishing, agricultural work or logging may be eligible for Migrant Education services. Children 14 and older may perform the qualifying work without a parent or guardian.

Families are interviewed by a recruiter to begin the process of determining student eligibility.
