- School screenings begin soon. This means students in several grades will have hearing, vision, and height & weight measured by the nurse per school district policy. If your student is prescribed glasses, please encourage them to wear the glasses each day so we can get accurate vision screenings.
- Flu shots are coming up! When we have specific dates, we will send home Flu Shot consents and give you more information about that.
- As the weather gets colder, please remember to encourage your students to wear warm winter clothing. Per school district policy, we are not allowed to keep students in from recess just because they forgot snow gear. Also, we are unable to keep students in during recess because parents say they are sick. If you think your student is too sick to go to recess, please keep them home. Of course if they have been to the doctor, and the doctor has written a note, we can keep them inside if the note is provided to the nurse.

PEAKS 2018 Student-Level Results

The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) is Alaska's summative assessment for students in grades 3-9 in English Language art and mathematics and grades 4, 8 and 10 in science and was administered in spring 2018. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide information to parents, educators, policy makers, communities and businesses about how Alaska's schools and districts are performing, along with an overall picture of an individual student's progress in meeting State of Alaska standards at his/her grade level.

At this time, districts and schools are beginning the score reporting process with the preliminary work of interpreting and understanding PEAKS results. The Anchorage School District is currently preparing our online student information system for parents to receive electronic PEAKS results on September 22st.

For both math and English language arts, each student will receive an overall score that is aligned to one of four achievement levels: Proficient, Advanced, Below-Proficient and Far-Below Proficient. Students performing at a scale score of 500 or more are Proficient. In addition, information on groups of standards, called reporting categories, will also be provided as part of the score reporting process. For detailed information on PEAKS score reporting, please reference the ASD PEAKS Parent Guide available on the ASD PEAKS website, http://www.asdk12.org/peaks/, along with the State of Alaska's Parent's Guides to Student Reports Spring 2018 PEAKS Assessment English Language Arts and Mathematics (and Science grades 4, 8 and 10), available on the Department of Education's website, https://education.alaska.gov/assessments/peaks.

Please remember, PEAKS is not a pass/fail test. PEAKS is aligned to the Alaska State Standards and the scores provide information to guide decision-making and support students on their path to success. Alaska increased the rigor of its standards and assessments so that our students are academically ready for jobs, career training and college. The Anchorage School District maintains high learning expectations for all students and is committed to preparing students for success in life.
