Monday Feb. 28, starts our ASD new mask mandates. Dr. Bishop sent home the new guidance. We look forward to a peaceful implementation tomorrow. The following are the highlights and communication guidance at Denali. Parents / Guardians will make the choice for their children. We will not ask students about their choice. We also will not monitor that the parent/guardian choice is followed. Our focus remains on teaching and learning. Adults, staff and parents and volunteers, will make their own choice about mask wearing. We will not ask you about your choice. We will practice our Montessori values of respect, kindness, and graciousness regardless of our personal choices. Sanitation at lunchtime and after school will continue. We also continue to be symptom-free at school. Masks continue to be required on all busses at this time due to Federal Guidelines.

Spring Summative Testing is the end of March and first week of April. We have a new vendor this year. It is actually NWEA (Northwest education association) who also does our 3-6 grade benchmark assessments. In order to be sure we are testing your child's content knowledge and not their ability to navigate the program and computer, the state offers practice tests. Our teachers will also make sure they are familiar with all the tools they will need to move around the screen to answer the items. I am so grateful to the staff, students, and parents for all your support over the 12 years I have been at Denali Montessori. This has been the shining culmination of my 30.8-year career. I will always hold Denali Montessori in my heart. **Yes, now the time has come for me to retire.** It's time for me to play. I had hoped to outlast COVID, but I think COVID is with us for some time to come. My last workday is June 1, 2022. Thank you all so much for everything. You are the best.

We are looking for volunteers to help at recess and in the morning on the playground. If you have time to help from 8:40-8:50 in the morning, we would love to have you out there so that our students can have some movement time before the start school for the day. Extra adults out on the playground will help keep them safer. Please let me know if you would like to do this one or more days a week.

Please do not turn right or left onto Barrow when children are crossing.

Please cross at the Barrow or the Cordova corners. Large cars cannot see our little ones crossing in the middle of the block. Also please be careful turning north on Barrow. Students cross 10th there and also cross Barrow there. Please stop and wait for our students to fully cross that intersection Ms. Davis has organized a fundraiser for our Life Skills Class to go to the Challenge Ski Event. This is expensive and so wonderful for our children. Below are links to the fundraising choices. She is also selling ice cream bars after school.

Dr Bishop has announced revised COVID protocols. They are on the links below. New CDC recommendations as a follow-up from this weekend's letter.

- Isolation period if you test positive for COVID-19 has been reduced from 10 days to 5 days.
- We only accept molecular test results. No antigen and/or home test results.

Please remember that our playground is rented until 6pm every evening during the school week. This means that it is not open for community playing or sledding. Students need to go home directly after school. Thank you for helping us keep your children safe during the transition to home every day. These dark afternoons make it even more important.

We've had more field trips planned in the coming months. See below for the chaperone information. It is different than our volunteer requirements. **We are no longer requiring vaccination on day field trips.**

Arrival & Dismissal: 10th Street is our only supervised arrival and dismissal point for kindergarten through 6th grade. Only pre-school dismisses from the front. Any students dropped off in the morning at the front parking lot, need to walk around to the ramp on 10th street to wait in the playground where there is supervision. We have no supervision in the front. Please let me know if you have any questions

We go in immediately in the mornings if the temperature is at 0 degrees. This is due to the dark and early morning that the temperature is different than from recess.

We have a **volunteer box** in the teacher workroom for anyone with a few minutes time to help out our teachers. You need not have a child in that teacher's classroom to help out. We appreciate our families and are enjoying your support in our school once again

this year. Please remember, wear a mask and be symptom-free when you are in our school.

PTSA reminds us that it's never too late to join. We cannot do it without you. PTSA funds our Montessori training that keeps us a viable member of the American Montessori Association and provides much of the authentic materials needed to teach Montessori curriculum.

We are part of the Thursday Fruit Day. Thursday mornings fruit will be delivered to everyone to their classrooms. The specific fruit varies each week.

We continue to have free lunch and breakfast through December from our CARES monies. However, you still need to renew your Free & Reduced lunch application. There was some confusion about this when letters went home. It was the qualification for Free and Reduced lunch that expired. Milk money can still be bought separately and you can establish an account for this. Email denali_cafe@asdk12.org if you have questions. Elizabeth has been wonderful about reaching out to answer questions.

Students who have been waiting to be assessed for our IGNITE program will be tested by a team at our school October 18 & 19. **All 2nd graders will receive a group screening to see if they are potentially eligible.**

Starting October 24 all phone calls need to use 10 digits. This includes the area code.

Please note our calendar dates through our first semester. Let Alicia or Keiarra know if you are out for a planned absence. This should avoid the automatic call.

Latest COVID Guidance:

1. If you have symptoms, you have three choices regardless of Vaccination status;
 - a. Get a doctor's note indicating cause of symptom and that it is not COVID related
 - b. Quarantine for 10 days
 - c. Get a COVID test
2. Nurse Marissa has been trained now to **administer COVID tests to staff, students, (with parent permission), and parents.** The tests will go to the testing facility every day via school bus at 3:30pm. Nurse Marissa can now test if you have any symptoms or if you simply want to check that you are COVID free. The registration process is somewhat lengthy. See Nurse Marissa for information about how to register. A flyer will go out soon with this information. I've been getting my result back that evening, so it is fairly quick.

Please label your students' gear. Make sure they are dressed appropriately for the weather. I know I check my weather app before I decide what coat I am wearing for the day. Hats, gloves, snow pants, and boots will be a necessity soon. As our kindergarten team noted, we all shop at the same places, so **label, label, label**. We pick up stray clothing after each recess and put it into our lost and found by the playground door. You are welcome to check it as soon as you notice a clothing item missing.

Due to rising COVID numbers, We are resuming lunches in the classrooms again. Two and only two classes will be allowed in the MPR for lunch on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. They will be spread out over at least two rows of tables. Seating charts have been and are still required for eating times. There is no freedom of movement during eating. We are teaching the student to use intermittent masking during eating times. This means that students lower their masks to take a bite or drink, then raise them masks back over their nose to chew or swallow. This will reduce the actual time unmasked. We continue to sanitize after lunch and at the end of the day. Students continue to sanitize or wash their hands with soap and water upon entering the classroom or specials. Classroom Student Behavior will result in the following:

- Teacher will have quiet meeting away from others with student to reteach behavior
- Teacher will have family meeting for repetitive behavior
- Students will be allowed to reset in the Peace area or Buddy Room with clear directions about time and tasks while there.
- Any repetitive, violent, or unsafe behavior is addressed with the principal who will meet with the student, provide reteaching, determine the consequence, and let the teacher and parent know.

- Pre-school parents are meeting their children out front on the red curb at 3:30pm

- Lower EI parents are meeting their children on the basketball court at 3:25pm
- Upper EI parents are meeting their children on 10th Street at 3:30pm.

I appreciate everyone's feedback. That helped us make this work.

Montessori meets the child where they are at. This will help us individualize our instruction to match your child's needs.

The days are getting chillier. Make sure your children come to school with the appropriate weather gear. We do go out when there is light rain. We also go out to -5 or -10 degrees below 0 including the wind chill. Those days are sure to come this winter.

Denali Montessori School Day and Arrival /Dismissal Protocols

The School Hours are 9:00-3:30

Parent pick – up and drop- off will be from 10th Street only.

8:30am Breakfast starts. Children should enter the front of the school and go to the MPR

8:40-8:50am Students may arrive on the supervised playground. Kindergarten students will wait on the kindergarten playground outside their classroom door.

8:50am Teachers will bring their students into the classroom.

3:20 PM Kindergarten will be dismissed with their older siblings from the Kindergarten Playground to parents.

3:25 pm: Lower EI will be dismissed with their older siblings. Teachers will lead them to the basketball court on the playground for you to meet your child.

3:30 pm Upper EI will be dismissed to their designated spots on 10th Street.

3:30pm Pre-School and their older siblings will be led out to the front of the school by Ms. Leah and Ms. Kim. You will meet them by staying in your car on the red curb in the parking lot.

The ramp gate will close at 9:00am and 3:40pm

If the gate is closed in the morning or afternoon, go to the front of the school to enter through the office.

Community Schools will enter through the office and will be met by Community Schools staff to help them to their room.

Campfire will enter through 9th Street and be met by Campfire staff to guide them to the MPR.
