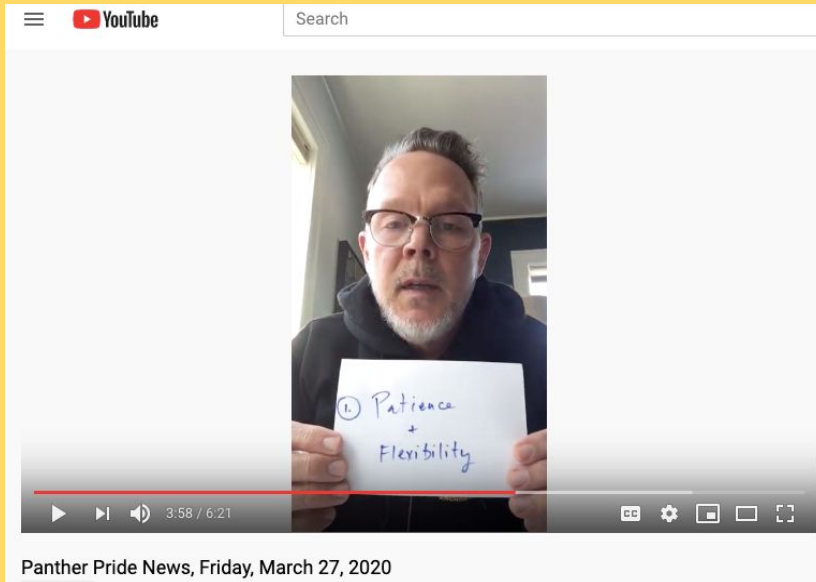
Online Launch Begins, March 31

Mears Families,

I hope this newsletter finds you and all of our students doing well. As we head toward the end of our second week of school closure, there are a number of important announcements to make, which are included in this newsletter. Most notably, the teachers and staff at Mears are pleased to announce that we are preparing to launch the first stage of online learning next week on Tuesday, March 31st. We are very excited to re-engage with our students!



The transition to online learning is truly monumental and is being made possible due to the dedication and hard work of teachers and staff throughout the Anchorage School District. It is no small feat to prepare thousands of staff and 50,000 students for an online learning experience. And, yet, we are scheduled to begin the rollout in just a few days.

This historic shift will move teachers and students from the centuries-old model of teaching

and learning face-to-face to one that works remotely. Given the nature of the change, it is important that we remind one another of a few crucial points: 1) to be patient with ourselves and each other as we learn a new way of teaching and learning, 2) that we commit to doing our very best each day, and 3) to always try to be grateful for the good things we have in our lives.

I, for one, am extremely grateful to have the opportunity to work on behalf of the students, families, teachers, and staff who make up this wonderful school community.

Important Updates:

Online Learning Launch:

The transition to online learning in ASD will occur in stages, with different subjects being phased in and introduced over the coming weeks:

Tuesday, March 31 -- English Language Arts and Mathematics

Monday, April 6 -- Science and Social Studies

Monday, April 13 -- Electives

Teachers will keep a daily Office Hours schedule when students can check in with their teachers for feedback and support. The Office Hour Schedule will be published soon. Stay tuned for updates.

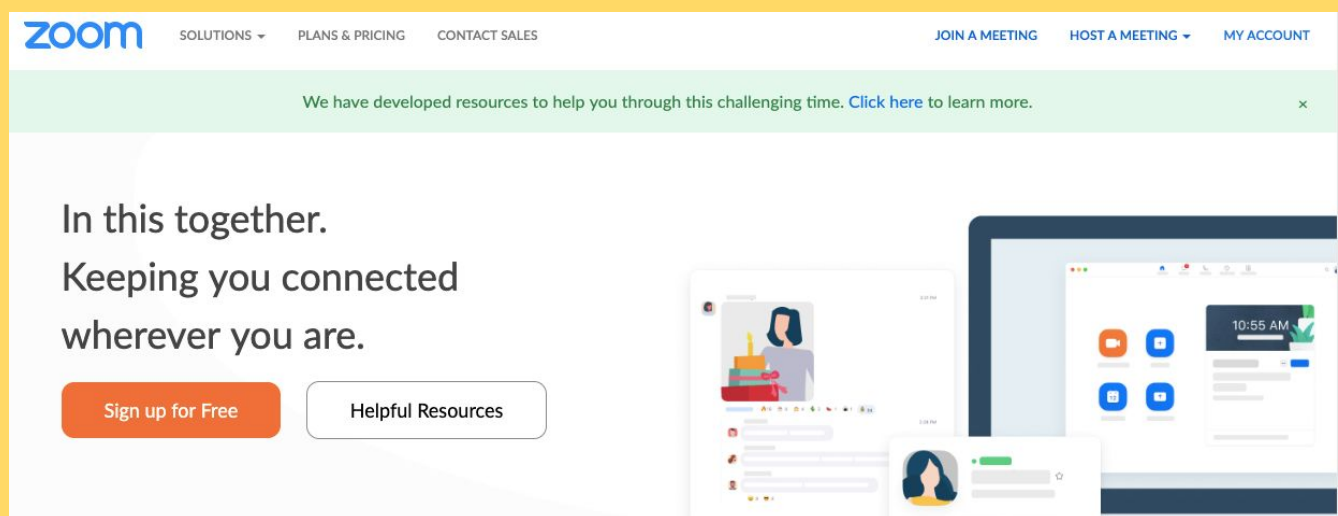
All teachers will be facilitating learning using the Canvas Learning Management System, which has been used successfully by teachers in ASD's iSchool over the last decade.

Curriculum is being organized by ASD teacher-led teams and is designed to ensure equity and accessibility. Providing access to all students is a high priority in the district and at Mears. For this reason, curriculum modules in the various subject areas will be uniform and all teachers will deliver content using the Canvas platform. We want to be sure that all of our students have the same opportunity to access content, as well as receive helpful support and guidance from teachers and staff.

In the next few days, more information will be provided by ASD and Mears about the specifics of online learning. Support will be provided to ensure that our students are able to connect with their teachers, log into their classes, and access the new online curriculum.

Communicating with Zoom:

Teachers and staff will be utilizing Zoom for video conferencing with students during Office Hours. Zoom will also be used to communicate with parents and families during this period of school closure. It is highly recommended that families download Zoom onto your devices to help facilitate communication.

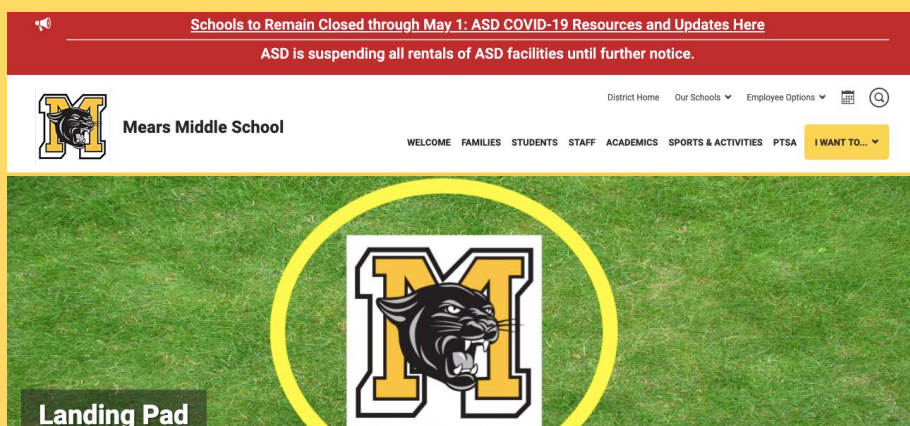
Technology Distribution:

ASD is working to ensure that students and families have the technology they need to access online curriculum. For the families who need it, the district aims to provide one Chromebook computer per family. The district may also assist with internet connectivity.

Understandably, ASD will distribute Chromebook computers and modem hotspots to students in high school first, as they are working on completing credits toward graduation. Distribution to high schools is tentatively scheduled to begin on Monday, March 30. Technology for students in middle school will follow. 
Student Nutrition

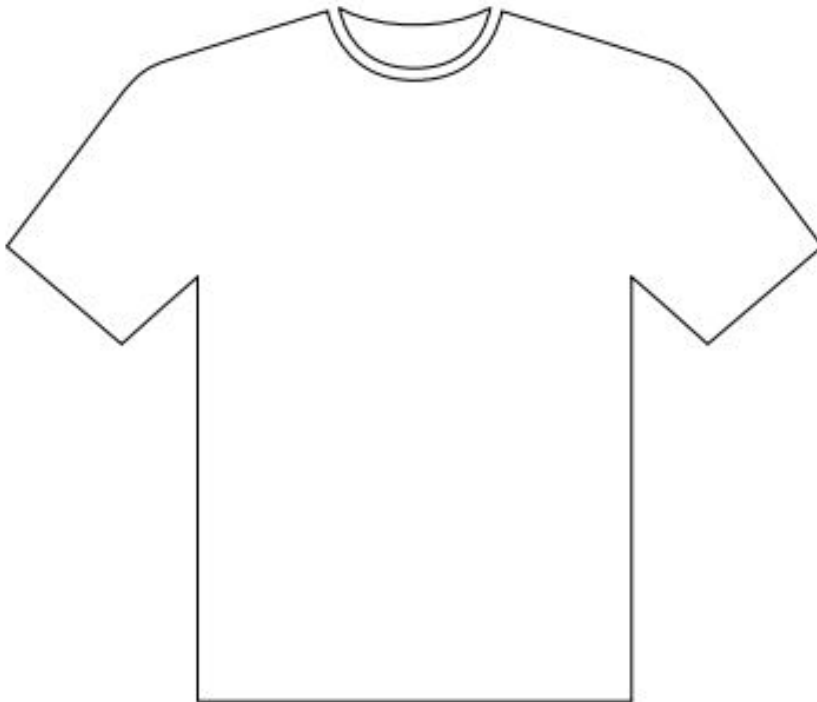
