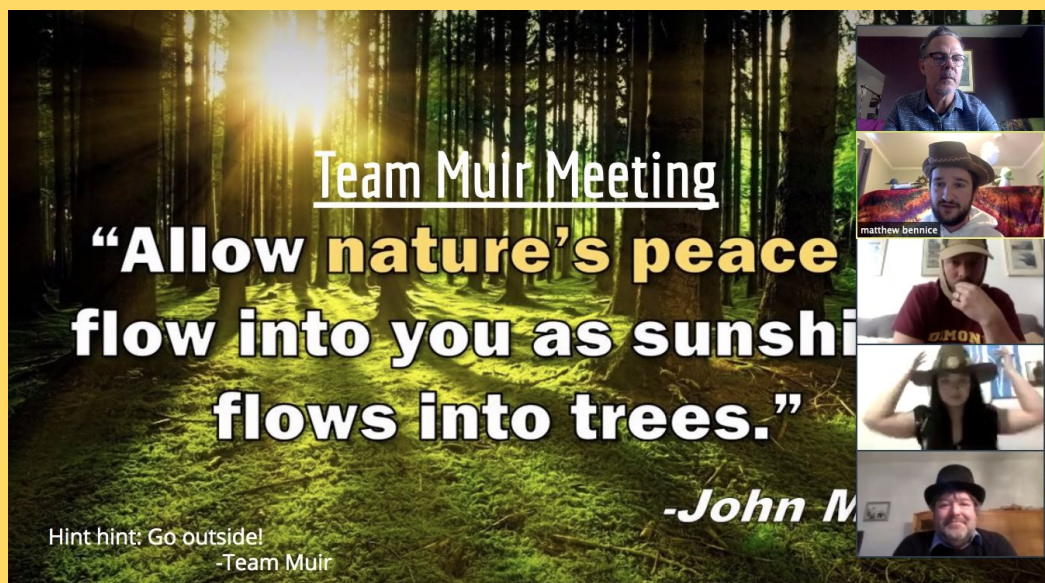

Mears Welcomes Baby York!



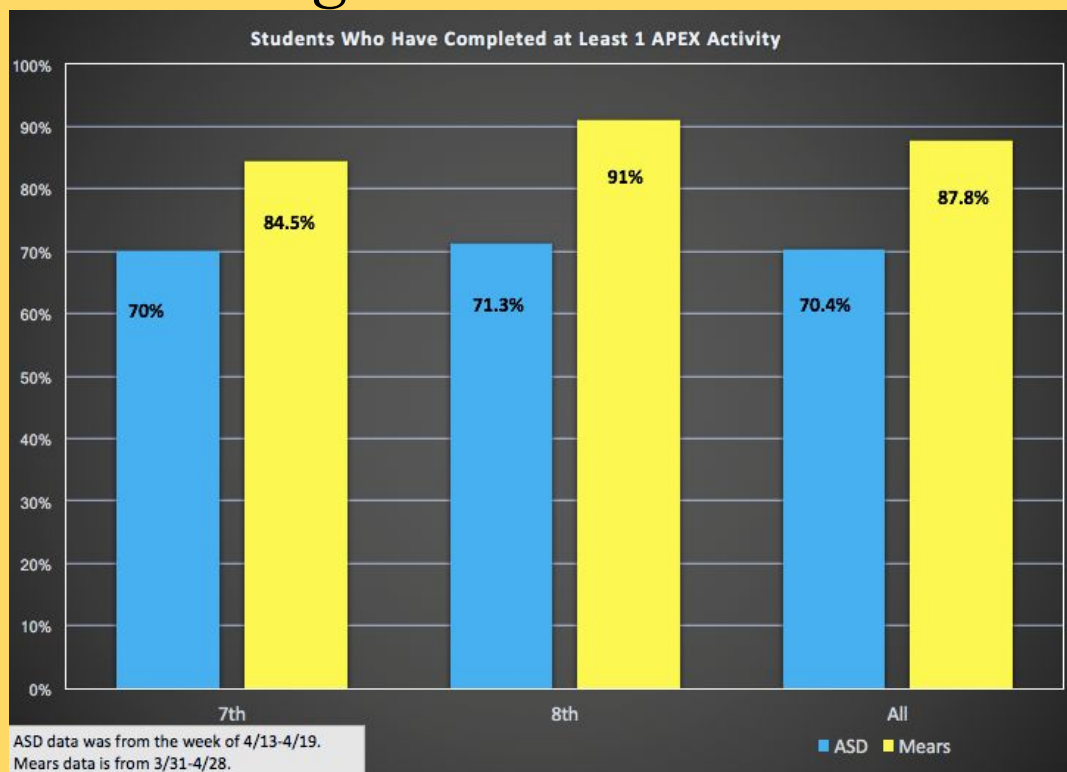

Access to Student Personal Items:

Mears student locker-item pick up begins next week on May 4th. The schedule below indicates the schedule of dates and times for pick up. Note: Musical instrument pick up is a separate process and will occur the week of May 11. More information to follow.

The pick up process requires that families indicate their student's last name form their care as they pull up. See the photo below for the parking lot map. We ask that only one family member be out of the car at a time. Please do not approach staff. The staff member will set the bag(s) with your student's items on the sidewalk. Once the staff member walks away from the bag, please approach, pick up the bag, and return to your care to leave. We appreciate your patience, as the process may take a few minutes. Any items not picked up during your assigned time will be safely stored until the Fall; there will not be an additional opportunity for these items to be picked up this school year.

Mifi Hotspots Distribution

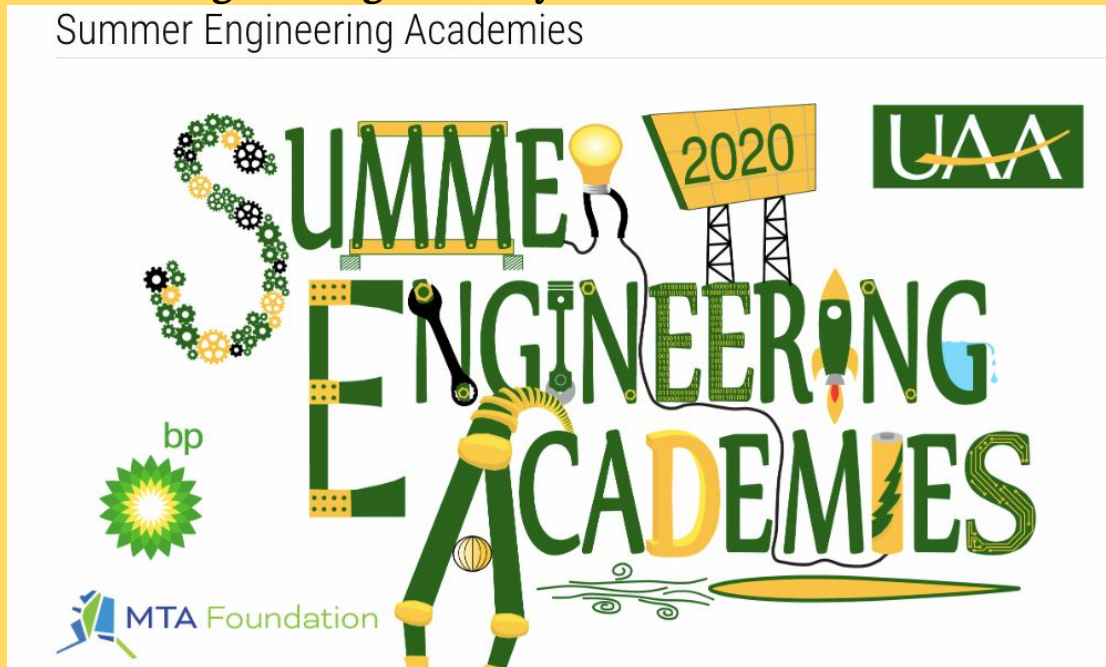

Summer Engineering Academies

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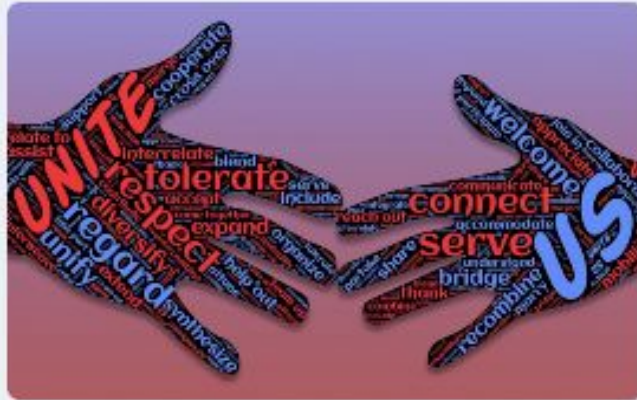
The UAA Summer Engineering Academies are a series of fun, hands-on, and engineering-themed summer camps for middle school and high school students. This summer, the Academies have moved completely online, with week-long camps focused on coding, 3D modeling, and videography. This is a great way to flex those learning muscles over the summer and increase interest in science, technology, engineering, and math.

How does it work? The camps feature:

- Pre-recorded video lectures and activities led by UAA faculty, which can be accessed at any time;
- Live lectures and activities for several hours per week led by UAA faculty;
- One-on-one and group assistance through video calls, voice calls, and live chat with College of Engineering students;
- Free online tools and software;
- Opportunities for teamwork and collaboration; and
- Progressively difficult activities that lead to an end-of-week project.
