MAP Growth Newsletter Information 2023-2024

MAP Growth is the ASD and State of Alaska required benchmark/interim assessment for students in grades 3-9 in reading and mathematics. Grades 10-12 students identified as needing Tier II and Tier III reading and mathematics support also take MAP Growth as part of the Anchorage School District's MTSS framework.

Alaska's Department of Education and Early Development (DEED) has partnered with NWEA to implement a creative approach to a balanced statewide assessment that connects fall and winter MAP Growth benchmark/interim assessments and the Alaska spring AK STAR summative assessment. AK STAR eliminates the spring benchmark/interim assessment window for grades 3-9 by combining the summative and benchmark assessment into one test that produces a spring benchmark score, which includes a growth measure. More information is available at the State of Alaska AK STAR website, <u>education.alaska.gov/assessments/akstar</u>.MAP Growth is an online, adaptive assessment that provides each student a personalized testing experience with data that speaks to their individual progress and growth in mathematics and reading.

The MAP Growth reading and mathematics benchmark will be administered in person during the 2023-2024 fall and winter benchmark windows. The spring benchmark will be embedded in the AK STAR summative assessment as outlined above.

- Fall Benchmark 1: September 5 September 15 (make-ups through September 22)
- Winter Benchmark 2: December 4 December 15 (make-ups through December 21)
- Spring Benchmark 3: embedded in AK STAR administered during the summative assessment window: March 25 April 5 (make-ups through April 26)
 - MAP Growth assessment only: Grades 10-12 identified as needing Tier II and III support

MAP Growth practice tests and tutorials allow students and families the opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions and tools available on the actual MAP Grow assessments such as the highlighter and calculator. An overview of these resources with links to the practice tests are compiled on the <u>MAP Growth Practice Tests Quick Sheet</u>.



DID YOU KNOW...

Showing up on time every day is important to your child's success and learning from preschool forward.

Missing 10% of school (1 or 2 days every few weeks) can make it harder to:

- Gain early reading and math skills.
- · Build relationships.
- · Develop good attendance habits.

High quality preschool and kindergarten has many benefits!

- The routines your child develops will continue throughout school.
- · Make the most of early grades by encouraging your child to attend every day.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Work with your child and his/her teacher to develop your child's strong attendance.

Talk about it - sing about it - make it an adventure!

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Share ideas with other parents for getting to school on time.

Before the school year starts

- Find out what day school starts and begin a countdown!
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Attend orientation with your child to meet teachers and classmates and find out about health and safety procedures.

Ready, Set, GO!

- If you are concerned your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice. Ask for resources to continue learning at home if needed.
- Ask family members or neighbors for assistance if you need help.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 medical appointments and extended trips when school is not in session.
- If your child seems anxious about preschool or kindergarten, talk to the program director, teacher, your doctor or other parents for advice.

As part of The Alaska Reads Act, the State of Alaska requires that districts administer an early literacy screening tool three times a year to students in grades K-3 to identify potential reading difficulties in order to improve reading outcomes for students. Families can read more about this comprehensive K-3 reading policy at The Alaska Reads Act website: education.alaska.gov/akreads

mClass with DIBELS 8th Edition Assessments is the State of Alaska Department of Education's and ASD's Early Literacy benchmark screening and progress monitoring tool for students in grades K-3 in reading. mClass utilizes curriculum-based measures and is used by schools as part of the ASD Comprehensive Assessment System to support informed instructional decisions.

Taku's attendance data shows that about 55% of students attended school 90% of the time.

Please send your child(ren) to school every day on time, unless they're sick!

Why It Matters

If children don't show up for school regularly, they miss out on fundamental reading and math skills and the chance to build a habit of good attendance that will carry them into college and careers.

Preliminary data from a California study found that children who were chronically absent in kindergarten and 1st grade were far less likely to read proficiently at the end of 3rd grade.

The Buzz with Bauer

In order to thrive, relationships need frequent care and attention. Family rituals allow families to slow down and connect, and they're associated with powerful benefits. They give you and your children a sense of security, identity and belonging. They can help children feel safe during



uncertainty or change. Whether it's a shared coffee/hot chocolate every morning, or a ten-minute check-in before bed, it is a special time for you and your families to connect, share affection, and be fully present. Family rituals are a way to focus energy with your families this holiday season and into the new year!



As a family, use the tips and examples below to create your own rituals:

Just be together:

Spend quality, uninterrupted time together, even if it's only for five minutes.

Eliminate distractions:

Turn off the TV, put away/silence cell phones, and move away from any other distractions that interrupt.

Keep it simple:

A ritual doesn't have to be a big event. It can be as simple as listening to a favorite song together. *Make it a priority:*

Protect the time you set aside for your ritual, even when life gets busy.

Be completely present:

Spend time mindfully, focusing on your family and the experiences you're sharing.

Keep it simple:

A ritual doesn't have to be a big event. It can be as simple as sitting and reading a book together or going on a short walk.

Do it consistently:

Make it a routine of doing the ritual weekly (more if you want).

A few ideas for family rituals:

Arrivals & Departures:

When leaving for the day or returning home, connect with your family for a few moments. Discuss plans for the day, share an embrace, or talk about something that's on your mind. Have a mindful interaction, versus a rushed goodbye.

Morning or Evening Walk:

Take a walk around your neighborhood after dinner. Be mindful, paying attention to the sights, sounds, and smells outside that you would normally overlook. After a few minutes, take turns sharing what you noticed.

Quality time:

Choose a day and time each week to do something together that brings you joy.

Get moving:

Go for a walk, run/jog, practice yoga, play a favorite sport, or any physical activity. Get in a routine of doing exercise together daily or certain days of the week.
