Superintendent





The assessment is given three times each academic year and the results are used by teachers to identify important areas of needed academic focus and support for individuals and groups of students. MAP assessment results are also used by counselors, department chairs, and administrators to ensure that students are scheduled in the most appropriate classes in math, language arts, and science.

Lyrics-to-Poetry Tips

- Consider what the line you chose means to you.
- Once removed from the song, can the line take on a new and different meaning?
- Experiment with different poetic devices: rhyme, repetition, alliteration (the repetition of sound), simile, metaphor or personification.
- Poems can be rhyming or non-rhyming but must begin and end with the same line from a song.
- At the end of your poem, give credit to the musician whose line you borrowed.
- Suggested length: 8-20 lines.

Mears Library Summer Reading Opportunities

Summer is a great time for kids to choose their own reading material. In the Kids & Family Reading Report from Scholastic 70% of kids who responded positively about enjoying summer reading said it was because they could choose what they wanted to read. One limiting factor for summer reading is access to books. Below are several ways students can access reading and listening material during the summer.

Anchorage Public Library Summer Discovery Program

The kick-off event will be held at the Loussac Library on May 14th from noon to 4pm. However, students may participate in the competition in person or virtually. Reading logs will be available on the <u>Summer Discover website</u> in May.

SORA - books, magazine, and audio

Students can read or listen to ebook, e-audiobooks, and now magazines in SORA. The SORA app is a free download for mobile devices and students use their regular district credentials to create an account. SORA is also available as a website on laptops and Chromebooks.

AudiobookSYNC 13+

This program is aimed at teens ages 13 and older, it offers a pair of electronic audiobooks every week from April 28th through August 17th. Register with an email address on the <u>AudioSYNC website</u>, then access and download the titles using SORA!

Added to these forms, if a student has tested positive for COVID-19 in the three months prior to the activity, families should fill out the **COVID-19 Return-To-Sports** form.

COVID-19 Return To Play

In addition to the standard forms and COVID-19 waiver, if a student has recently tested positive for COVID-19 and seeks to begin or return to a sport or activity, families should fill out the **COVID-19 Return-To-Sports** form. The school nurse can provide more information; however, it's essentially a form (linked above and below) that requires 2 steps:

- 1. If the student has a confirmed positive COVID-19 test, a healthcare professional must sign off that he/she is able to return to the sport or activity prior to participation (not required to return to school).
- Upon submission of this form, coaches will employ the slow re-entry process to ensure safety. Please view the document to see the transitional return process. (Apologies: Last week I included the wrong link-please view this one).

Although the form is not new, our employment of the document will be more stringent. All families that agree to participate in sports sign the COVID-19 waiver, which makes the Return to Play documentation part of the process.
