## **Resolution 2023-04: Establishment, Rights and Voting Privileges of Student School Board Members**

*Drafted by Joshua Pak (ASD Student Representative) and Ben Kolendo (MSBSD Head Student Representative)*

Proposed November 14, 2023

Passed January 16, 2024

### **Be it resolved by the Anchorage School District Student Advisory Board that:**

1. **Whereas**, the student board member on the school board has been a recognized member of the the Mat-Su Borough School Board in the MSBSD since its establishment in 1995<sup>2,3</sup>; and
2. **Whereas**, Board Policy 9110 not only bars the responsibilities of the current student representative, but for all student representatives in the future; and
3. **Whereas**, on September 6, 2023, the Mat-Su Borough School District, by a vote of 5-2, amended its Board Policy 9110, significantly reducing the role and responsibilities of its student representative by 1) revoking the power to cast preferential votes, 2) denying the student representative a position on the dais, and 3) denying the student representative the ability to engage in questioning witnesses and engaging in discussions on matters of the board<sup>1</sup>; and
4. **Whereas**, the Anchorage, Matanuska-Susitna, Fairbanks, Kenai, and Juneau school districts, each of the state's five largest school districts, as well as the State of Alaska Board of Education and Early Development, incorporate a student representative who is granted the opportunity to address meetings and participate in preferential voting<sup>4</sup>; and
5. **Whereas**, no known School Board in Alaska's history has ever reprimanded a student representative position before this decision; and
6. **Whereas**, the Alaska Association of School Boards contends that student representatives serving on school boards have not only made substantial and positive contributions to their respective school districts through their board positions but have also exhibited the ability to “judiciously leverage their positions to improves the way decisions are made by the entire board,” and “increases the confidence and commitment of all members”<sup>7,8</sup>; and

7. **Whereas**, it is recognized that student perspectives are invaluable in shaping the educational program and fostering a conducive learning environment within the school district<sup>5</sup>; and
8. **Whereas**, to ensure student input and engagement in the decision-making process, School Boards with an average daily membership exceeding 5,000 shall establish a Student Government Association (SGA)<sup>6</sup>; and
9. **Whereas**, the SGA shall be responsible for the election of a student representative member to serve on the School Board; and
10. **Whereas**, it is imperative to delineate the rights and privileges afforded to Student Board members to guarantee their meaningful participation and contribution to the Board's proceedings<sup>6</sup>; and

**Therefore, be it resolved that the ASD Student Advisory Board urges the Alaska State Board of Education and Early Development to adopt the following into regulation:**

**Section 1: Establishment of Student Board Member Position**

School Boards with an average daily membership exceeding 5,000 hereby establishes the position of a Student Board Member to represent the student body on the School Board. This position shall be filled by a student elected by the Student Government Association.

**Section 2: Student Board Member Rights**

- a. Student board members shall have the right to attend all public meetings of the School Board.
- b. Student board members shall be recognized at meetings and given the opportunity to participate in questioning witnesses and discussing issues brought before the Board.
- c. Student board members shall receive all materials and documents presented to regular board members, with the exception of materials related to executive sessions.
- d. Student board members shall have the authority to make motions and second motions during board meetings.
- e. Student board members shall hold the official title of "School Board Member."

**Section 3: Student Board Member Voting Privileges**

- a. Student board members are granted the privilege to cast votes on all matters discussed by the board, except for issues subject to executive session discussion.
- b. A School Board may decide to make the student board members vote preferential.
- c. Preferential votes must be cast prior to the official board vote and shall not impact the final outcome of any vote and shall be recorded in the official minutes of the School Board meetings.

#### **Section 4: Implementation**

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon acknowledgement by the School Board and shall remain in force until amended or revoked by Alaska State School Board action.

#### **Section 5: Review**

The Alaska State School Board shall periodically review the effectiveness of this resolution in ensuring meaningful student engagement and may make necessary adjustments as deemed appropriate.

**Action Statement:** if passed by the ASD SAB, the ASD SAB shall vigorously advocate for its adoption, and ensure the enduring preservation of the establishment, rights, and voting privileges of Student Board Members across Alaska. Concurrently, we shall promptly send this resolution as a formal statement to the Alaska Senate during the 33rd Legislative Session with the objective of encouraging permanent safeguards to protect the rights of all present and future student board members from any diminution or infringement.
