

Introduction and Overview of CIP



I. Introduction and Overview of CIP Document

The Anchorage School Board is responsible for providing an adequate educational environment for the students of Anchorage. To fulfill this obligation, the school board regularly engages in comprehensive long-range planning of school facility construction, renovation, and maintenance. On an annual basis, the school board adopts a Capital Improvement Plan that addresses the anticipated levels of student enrollment and shifts in enrollment, along with school facility condition and functionality from an educational perspective. Typically, this plan delineates the district's construction priorities over the succeeding six-year period.

The steps in preparing the Six-Year CIP are listed below:

- 1. Survey all district principals to determine school space utilization.
- 2. Collect birth data from the State of Alaska Bureau of Vital Statistics and population data from the State demographer.
- 3. Project six-year membership by school and grade.
- 4. Receive administrative recommendations for alleviating negative conditions projected in facility usage based on the six-year forecast.
- 5. Obtain approved recommendations from the district's Capital Improvement Advisory Committee.
- 6. School board review and approval of the CIP.
- 7. Present board approved CIP to the Municipal Planning and Zoning Commission for comments.
- 8. Transmittal of CIP to Anchorage Assembly and to the State Department of Education and Early Development (EED).

School Facilities



II. School Facilities

The Anchorage School District operates and maintains the largest physical plant of any public entity in the state, with approximately 7.7 million square feet of facilities. The replacement value of district buildings is nearly \$2 billion. The district has 93 facilities, comprised of 87 schools and 6 support facilities. In addition, there are 14 alternative and charter school programs. The district houses more than 48,000 students and nearly 5,000 staff members.

Forty-four elementary schools are organized K-6, while Chester Valley, Chugiak, Creekside Park, Fire Lake, Mountain View, Muldoon, Nunaka Valley, Ptarmigan, Russian Jack, Scenic Park, Susitna, Tyson, Williwaw, and Wonder Park elementary schools are organized K-5. Aurora, Mt. Spurr, Orion, Ursa Major and Ursa Minor elementary schools are located on Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson. Due to a decline in enrollment on Fort Richardson, Kennedy Elementary School was closed at the end of the 1999-2000 school year, and is being used by the district's Information Technology Department. Two elementary schools have a K-8 organizational pattern: Northern Lights ABC and Girdwood K-8 School.

Central, Goldenview, Gruening, Hanshew, Mears, Romig and Wendler middle schools are organized for grades 7–8. Begich, Clark, and Mirror Lake middle schools are organized for grades 6-8. Bartlett, Chugiak, Dimond, Eagle River, East, Service, South and West senior high schools are organized for grades 9–12.

Polaris K-12 School, an alternative elementary/secondary program, is organized for grades K–12. Crossroads and Steller Alternative secondary programs are organized 7–12. Two other alternative secondary programs are organized 9–12: AVAIL and Benny Benson. AVAIL is housed at the Fifth Avenue Mall; Benny Benson is housed at the ASD Benny Benson building, while Crossroads is housed at the Success by Six building in Mountain View. SEARCH, an alternative secondary program that is organized for grades 7-8, is also housed at the Benny Benson building. SAVE, another alternative secondary program, is organized 10-12 and is housed in its own facility.

Currently, there are eight Charter School programs offered in the ASD: Alaska Native Cultural (K-6), Aquarian (K-6), Eagle Academy (K-8), Family Partnership

(K-12), Frontier (K-12), Highland Tech (6-12), Rilke Schule (K-8), and Winterberry (K-8). Of these programs, Aquarian operates in an ASD facility while the other seven are housed in leased space.

Special Education services are offered in all elementary and secondary schools in the district. Two school facilities, Mt. Iliamna on JBER Elmendorf and Whaley School, are dedicated to serving students with significant disabilities.

In addition, the district operates four state contract programs: Alaska State School for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Providence Heights, McLaughlin School and New Path High School. The district also operates special educational programs for students in five residential facilities: Jesse Lee Home, Booth Memorial, McKinley Heights, Charter North Hospital and North Star Hospital.

III. <u>CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT NEEDS</u>

The Anchorage School District operates and maintains the largest physical plant of any public entity in the state. These facilities consist of approximately 7.7 million square feet in 87 schools and 6 support sites. Not only is the District's inventory of facilities large, it is also aging. Fifty-two schools are over 20 years old, and of these 22 are over 50 years old.

To care for this substantial investment, the district has implemented an integrated facility management program (FMP).

A key component of this program is the capital planning and assessment management system (CPMS). The CPMS database centralizes information on facility components and system conditions and a facility's ability to meet current educational program requirements. This information is collected during facility and educational assessments, by utilizing systematic, consistent, and repeatable methodologies to obtain the initial information and for ongoing efforts to maintain the long term usefulness of the information. The collected information serves as a basis to determine capital needs, priorities, educational inadequacies, facility capital costs and in developing short and long term facility planning and funding strategies.

Educational program requirements are defined by districtwide educational specifications for elementary, middle and high school levels. Educational adequacy assessments determine the ability of a school to meet educational program requirements by evaluating the quantity, configuration, size, and existence of spaces defined by educational specifications. For example, a school may not have enough classrooms to offer health classes, or a gymnasium in addition to a multi-purpose room in order to allow for concurrent lunches and physical activity.

Currently, facility condition assessments are complete for 93 facilities and educational program assessments are complete for 84 schools. Assessment data is updated on an annual basis as school upgrades are completed.


Information collected from facility condition and educational program assessments highlight the following key factors of the District's building inventory.

Building components wear out. Facility systems only last so long. Roofs deteriorate and leak; heating, plumbing, and ventilation systems wear out; and structural systems age. Various code changes require updating electrical and mechanical systems, access for persons with physical disabilities; removing hazardous materials, and renewing various building system components. Moreover, significant renewals often require structural upgrades to meet more stringent seismic codes.

Functional obsolescence is another fact of life for older schools. Over the life of a school, programmatic changes take place that demand updating the facility infrastructure. There is a continual need to update the electrical distribution systems in the schools to accommodate current technology. Current educational delivery methods require physical layouts that are often different and more flexible than those of 30 to 40 years ago. Without renewal, these schools do not provide ASD students the same educational opportunities through parity of program and facilities across the school system.

Additional capacity to house the constantly shifting student population is the third component of capital requirements. Anchorage is the largest district in the state, and while its overall enrollment has been steady in recent years, the geographic distribution of students continues to shift due to the high mobility of the Anchorage population. The district has over 130 relocatable classrooms available to meet short-term capacity needs in affected schools.

IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS: 2015-16 to 2020-21

Table 1 summarizes the recommended six-year capital improvement projects and their estimated cost. Table 2 provides brief descriptions for the projects shown in Table 1. Table 3 shows the agency interface required for undeveloped sites currently managed by the District. Initial project cost estimates are based on Fiscal Year 2014 costs with inflation adjustments for years two through six of the plan. Adjustment to these cost estimates will be made in future years due to fluctuations in construction costs and scope of work identified in the initial planning or design stages of the projects. In addition to the projects included in this CIP, the district also allocates general funds every year for Maintenance and maintenance projects, which is approximately \$21,350,000 for FY 2014-2015.

In 2009 the District initiated the development of an asset management system (CPMS) to assist in capital planning. The key component of which is an integrated facility management assessment program (FMAP). Information is collected during facility condition assessments utilizing a systematic and consistent methodology. Educational adequacy assessments determine the ability of a school to meet educational program requirements by evaluating the quantity, configuration, size, and existence of spaces defined by educational specifications. The collected information serves as a basis for determining priorities and costs of facilities' capital needs, and is used for both short term and long term planning purposes.

To date the District with assistance by consultants has completed facility condition assessments on 93 locations and educational adequacy assessment at 84 schools.

Table 4 is a summarization that provides information which describes the current status of those assessed facilities. The 6-Year CIP recommendation, Table 1, was developed by utilizing the Facility Condition Index (FCI), Educational Adequacy Index (EAI) and school's program capacity percentage found in this appendix.

Table 5 is the District's anticipated construction delivery schedule of large-scale projects that have been funded through Legislative appropriations, specifically, Stadium amenities and bleachers at high schools.



V. <u>Membership Projections Summary: 2015-16 to 2020-21</u>

Forecasting Methodology and Assumptions: The principal methodology used to project the 2015-16 through 2020-21 enrollment is known as the cohort-survival technique. The basic technique involves calculating the ratio of the number of students in one grade during one year compared to the number of students who "survive" the year and enroll in the next grade in the following year. This survival rate calculation treats the student body in an aggregate fashion, using historical membership data. It is affected by such factors as school promotion, net migration and withdrawal rates. All of these factors are included in the term "survival" as it is used in this context.

Projections for individual schools are derived using the benchmark numbers realized through the cohort-survival and kindergarten projection methods. The allocation of students to each school is done by examining historical trends in individual school membership, as well as historical and projected housing and economic trends for that area.

ASD projections contained in this document do not reflect the impact of any major events occurring in the next six years: construction of the natural gas pipeline, opening of ANWR for oil exploration, closure or expansion of military installations; major changes in the state's economic or political structure. It is assumed, however, that oil and mineral exploration will continue in Alaska throughout the decade. It is also assumed that industry other in Anchorage will continue to develop and their employment levels will affect the ASD membership.



VI. <u>Current Facilities Utilization</u>

Program Capacity: The district has made the decision to report its individual school capacities on a program, rather than EED, basis. EED calculations are based primarily on the square footage of the facility and the grade level of students attending the school (elementary or secondary). Based on these calculations, the prototypical 26-classroom school, such as Kincaid, Russian Jack or Lake Hood, has a capacity of 536 students. The EED capacities are often quite different from the program capacities computed on a school-by-school basis, with the number of classrooms and their utilization being the determining factors. For example, the Program Capacity for Kincaid is 449, Russian Jack is 424, and Lake Hood is 477. This difference in capacities for schools that are basically identical in structure is due to the nature of the programs functioning at each of these schools, or the utilization.

Facilities Utilization: Administrators are aware that some programs, or special services, require space beyond the normal capacity of a classroom. Therefore, in this report, information is provided to assist the schools and administration in evaluating the actual number of students that can be housed, based on classroom utilization. Part of this information is summarized in Tables 13-15, which lists information on each school related to number of classrooms, square footage, and relocatable units in use.

Schools Projected at Greater Than 120 Percent of Capacity: Table 16 lists the projected enrollment of all schools, for the next six years, as a percentage of capacity. Those schools at which the projected enrollment is greater than 120 percent for at least one of the six years projected are highlighted in bold print.






Percent of Program Capacity by Elementary Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Elementary Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Middle School Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Middle School Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by High School Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by High School Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Elementary Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Elementary Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Middle School Attendance Area




Percent of Program Capacity by Middle School Attendance Area
